Overview of the new licences





Convenience and grocery store licences

Integrating Liquor retail into a business will require applicants to obtain either a convenience store licence or a grocery store licence.



Convenience Store Licence

- Sell beer, cider, wine and ready-to-drink products
- Deliver liquor from the store
- Sampling is not permitted

Sept 5 Convenience stores can start selling



Grocery Store Licence

- Sell beer, cider, wine and ready-to-drink products
- Deliver liquor from the store
- Sample liquor or liquor products in store

Aug 1 Existing grocery stores can start selling

Oct 31 New grocery stores can start selling





Retail regulation landscape



Established legislation and regulation to allow these new licences.

The Ontario Government sets the minimum prices and taxes.

Liquor Licence and Control Act, 2019

- <u>Regulation 745/21</u>: General requirements
- <u>Regulation 746/21</u>: Details on the convenience and grocery store licences
- Regulation 750/21: Details on the minimum pricing of liquor



The AGCO licenses retailers, creates and enforces requirements for the safe and responsible sale of alcohol.

- Registrar's Standards
- Orders of Monetary Penalties

LCBO

LCBO is the exclusive wholesaler and is the only way to legally purchase alcohol.



Decide if it's right for you

Your store needs to meet certain requirements for it to be eligible. Make sure you meet these eligibility requirements before you apply. You will need to uphold these requirements to continue to sell alcohol. View the AGCO's website for more details.

Licence type	Retail floor space	Food products occupy at least 1/2 of retail floor space (or >10K sq ft)	Food products
Convenience	≤ 4000 square feet	Offer a variety of at least 5 types of the following food products	 □ Canned food □ Dry food □ Frozen food □ Fresh fruit □ Fresh vegetables □ Meat or meat alternatives □ Dairy or dairy alternatives □ Non-alcoholic beverages □ Baked goods □ Snack foods
Grocery	> 4000 square feet	Offer a variety of all of the following types of food products	





Not eligible


Your store is not eligible to sell alcohol if:

- It is "primarily identified to the public as a pharmacy"
- The retail floor space isn't fully enclosed by walls and all aspects of the sale can't take place in the retail floor space
- It doesn't sell enough food variety, or have enough space dedicated to selling nonprepared food
- It is in a First Nations community that doesn't allow alcohol retail stores





Cost of a Licence



Yearly licensing fee:

\$500 for convenience store licence

\$3,250 for grocery store licence





Other things to consider

Here are some requirements to think about to help your planning.



Can only sell alcohol between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m.



Minimum drinking age is 19



Mandatory training requirements for every person involved in sale, service, delivery of liquor



Minimum age for selling or handling liquor is 18



Liquor is only in one area of the store



Shelf space requirements to display small manufacturer products



No financial relationships with manufacturers/suppliers including "trade spend"



Cannot sell "private label" products

Participation in the Ontario Deposit Return Program

Special Rules for Existing Grocers with a Winery Retail Store



No unilateral termination of the lease of any offsite winery retail store before Jan 1, 2032.



Grocers with a beer and cider licence will be unable to sell wine until 2031, unless through a colocated store

Visit AGCO.ca for all the documentation you will need to prepare in advance and learn more about eligibility requirements.

New to the AGCO? Follow the guidance on AGCO.ca to create an iAGCO account.

Select the convenience or grocery licence in iAGCO

Fill in the information, upload documents, pay the fee, and submit the application.

If approved, you'll get a copy of your licence to print.

You'll be contacted by the LCBO via the email you provide the AGCO to begin onboarding.



If you already have an AGCO licence or seller registration, use your existing iAGCO account so your known applicant information can be applied to your new application saving effort and processing time.

LCBO Onboarding Process – At a Glance









O4 Get your store and staff ready






Prepare your staff

You and your staff must be of age and trained before alcohol is sold at the store.



Any person involved in the sale or delivery of alcohol must be at least 18 years of age.



Staff involved with selling alcohol must be certified by an AGCO approved training program.





Prepare your store

There are strict requirements on how to store and display your alcohol. You may have to make some changes to your store to meet these requirements.



Make sure there is a secure storage space



Convenience stores need to post the nearest location for customers to return empty containers



Set up your display to keep all products in one spot. We call this 'contiguous display'.



Grocery stores will need to accept returns



Don't indirectly or directly accept gifts/services/benefits from liquor manufacturers.

We call these 'inducements'.



Display a variety of products, including small manufacturers.

LCBO exclusive wholesaler – ordering process

Convenience and grocery stores will place orders with LCBO using our online order management system

A product catalogue is provided to ensure only eligible products are purchased and information is provided to meet shelf-space requirements Orders are fulfilled by one or more supplying sources

Supplying sources include the LCBO, Ontario producers and The Beer Store (if its vendor of record for product).

As the exclusive wholesaler, LCBO coordinates with all supplying sources

Orders are delivered by one or more companies

Deliveries can be made by LCBO's contracted carriers, Ontario producers or third-party logistics companies (e.g., TBS, TNG) Store operators pay LCBO directly for all orders and LCBO coordinates payment to suppliers

Store operators <u>do not</u> pay suppliers or supplying sources directly

The LCBO manages the financial transaction end to end





Supplying sources - fulfillment & delivery



LCBO Supplied Product

- All imported eligible products
- Domestic eligible products



Non-LCBO Supplied Product

Domestic eligible products

On behalf of the LCBO by:

- Ontario manufacturers of beer, wine, cider and ready-to-drink (RTD)
- The Beer Store (TBS)





Phase 1

Current licensed grocery stores permitted to sell RTD products and large pack-sizes of beer

No earlier than Aug 1

Phase 2

Newly licensed convenience stores permitted to sell beer, wine, cider, and RTD

No earlier than Sept 5

Phase 3

Newly licensed grocery stores permitted to sell beer, wine, cider, and RTD

No earlier than Oct 31

To start, convenience stores will be able to purchase eligible domestic products where local manufacturers and the Beer Store are the supplying source.

Additional products supplied by the LCBO will become available as of **Oct 1**.

The AGCO checks for compliance

The AGCO regularly checks to make sure our licensees are following all applicable laws and standards.

Here are some of the activities we do to make sure you are selling alcohol responsibly.

1

Inspections

AGCO inspectors visit your store to check that you are following all the laws and regulations. They will inspect your location looking for compliance to all the laws, acts, regulations and standards

2

Mystery shoppers

In the Mystery Shopper program, youthful-looking adult mystery shoppers act like customers and try to buy liquor at licensed establishments. This information helps the AGCO evaluate how licensees are performing in meeting their regulatory responsibilities especially around not selling to minors.

3

Education

Inspectors will work with you to help you understand your obligations as a liquor licensee. They are here to help if you ever have questions.





Enforcement

Compliance Focused: The AGCO will use a variety of tools, including education, warnings, monetary penalties, suspensions and in the most serious cases, licence revocation.

Enhanced Enforcement Strategy: The AGCO will impose stronger penalties for first and second infractions where circumstances warrant, including to target priorities as the marketplace expands.

Warning

A formal warning that you are not meeting your responsibilities

Monetary penalty

A financial consequence where the licensee pays a defined amount

Suspension

Can't sell alcohol for a period of time

Revocation

Lose your licence and ability to sell alcohol





Do your part in keeping the public safe

There are many requirements you need to meet and follow to sell alcohol responsibly. When the AGCO inspects your store, we first look to make sure you are addressing these areas of highest risks.



Sell legal liquor

Your store only offers and sells alcohol bought legally from the LCBO.



Sell only during the allowable time

You are only selling alcohol between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m.



Don't sell to minors

You are checking ID to ensure people buying alcohol are of the legal drinking age.



Don't sell to intoxicated people

You know the signs of intoxication (drunk, high) and refuse to sell them alcohol.





How long will it take?

Here are some things to think about to help your planning.

Applications open June 17.

If you hold another, active AGCO licence or registration you will most likely see your retail licence issued within a matter of **days**.

Otherwise, you can expect the AGCO's eligibility review of your convenience or grocery store application to take **3-6 weeks**.

It takes up to **6 weeks** to onboard with the LCBO, as well as purchase and receive products, while preparing your store and completing training.

You can only start selling from your legal sale date:

- August 1 for existing grocery
- September 5 for convenience stores
- October 31 for new grocery stores.






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
